Reports

As always you will receive a report for your child outlining their progress in Semester One, 2020 against the Victorian Curriculum. The report may look different however, as it is not possible to implement our standard report writing process.

We have received advice from the Department of Education and Training regarding modifications to Semester One reporting. This takes into account the limitations on the ability of teachers to accurately assess student progress during the remote learning period.

As a result of this advice, only the Warri and Yern classes will be providing a 5 point scale for curriculum areas in the usual comparative table format.

The report comment on student achievement will be:

- a description of the areas of the Victorian Curriculum taught
- a descriptive assessment of student learning achievement, based on the Achievement Standards in the Victorian Curriculum.
- a comment on how the student has adjusted to the remote and flexible learning environment, with reference to the Personal and Social Capability curriculum.

The end of year report will have a more informed and accurate assessment of your child's progress against the Victorian Curriculum.

As always, if you have any concerns regarding your child's academic progress or development please speak directly to the teacher. An organized meeting time can be arranged for you.

Parent teacher interviews this year will be conducted on Thursday 30th July.

Student Support Group Meetings will be arranged in the first two weeks back to school instead of interviews for key students.
