Onsite Supervision- updated guidelines from DET

On-site supervision will be available for P-10 students in the following categories:

- children whose parents cannot work from home and where no other supervision arrangements can be made (not only those defined as permitted workers)
- vulnerable children including:
 - children in out-of-home care
 - children deemed by Child Protection and/or Family Services to be at risk of harm
 - children identified by the school as vulnerable (including via referral from a family violence agency, homelessness or youth justice service or mental health or other health service).
- Any child with a disability.

If you or your child fits into one of these categories and supervision is required, I need 3 days notice to organize staff.

During supervision, there will be always two staff rostered. They will be continuing to provide online learning, meeting and breakout sessions with their own class at the same time.

Staff on premises and student attendance

In conjunction with DET guidelines all staff who can work from home, will be doing so. This includes the office staff. Chez and Fiona will both be in attendance Wednesdays if you need to pop in for any reason.

Both Fi and Chez will be able to be contacted by email or you can call me on 0438078167.

If your child is sick and not engaging in online learning, please do not leave a message on the absence line, email the school or alternately ring me and I can forward the message. It is a requirement of DET to continue to monitor attendance even during remote learning.
