Michelle and I attended the Resource Smart Schools progress workshop yesterday at Birrugurra Primary School. We had time to look at our 12 month data and we are thrilled to announce that now our consumption of electricity is half the kWh usage per student, when compared to the RSS benchmark. Changing our lighting to LED, has had a positive impact on our usage.

We are now waiting assessment on our core Resource Smart School star.

Our Sustainability Leaders, Mischa and Mitchell, will be working with Jill Buscombe, RSS facilitator in the next few weeks to input bills and other data onto the portal so we can continue to track our progress.
